BACKGROUND ON HISPANIC HEALTH COMMITTEE AND PARTNERS

- Hispanic Advisory Board disbanded
- Still want Hispanic and Latino/a –focused group
- Healthy Klamath Network to "house" HHC and Klamath County Public Health to coordinate*
- Held kickoff meeting in February 2022
 - Discussed name for committee and overall objective
 - Discussed leadership opportunities
 - Who's missing from the table



HISPANIC HEALTH COMMITTEE STRATEGIC PLAN

- Improved health and wellbeing for the Hispanic population of Klamath County
 - Health broadly defined to include social determinants of health
 - Goals
 - i. Convening regularly
 - ii. Sharing resources and information
 - i. Mass communication
 - ii. Community calendar
 - iii. Recruiting volunteers for community outreach events
 - iv. Potentially assisting in research
 - v. Guide and consult with other community organizations to for culturally appropriate services and effective outreach



HIGHLIGHTING THE NEED

"Our Latino community has many obstacles that they face each day. During the pandemic, I noticed that our community was not getting current information. Things were changing too fast and by the time the information was given to our community it was already out of date. Having a radio station in Klamath County is crucial so individuals can get important information now.


Our community passes information by word of mouth; unfortunately, many times crucial information gets left out as information is being passed from person to person. Getting correct information from the radio station is essential and dire."



PUBLIC HEALTH MODERNIZATION-THE CONCEPT


 Framework that ensures all communities in Oregon have the same level of services (foundational programs and capabilities) from our public health system





PARTNERSHIPS DEVELOP AND GROW

- Vaccine outreach events and mass media education campaigns
- Launched 'Conquer Covid Campaign' with Wynne Broadcasting
- Started dreaming about a Spanish radio station...





ORIGINAL PLAN

- Streaming station (and website)
- Building capacity
 - Radio producer did his homework
 - Worked with HHC to choose a name
 - Developed logo



- KCPH funded for full year and all partners to submit content for free
- Surprise!



LA PATRONA AND LA VOZ DE KLAMATH

- Planning meetings with HHC and Wynne Broadcasting
- Blend of HHC content + radio expertise
- Launched May 2023
- All partners could submit content to both radio and website.



LA PATRONA LAUNCHES



- Held contests
- Flyers distributed around town
- Stickers and T shirts
- Hired local part time staff to promote and sell ads
- For every business purchasing ads on English stations, ask about also Spanish







SUSTAINING THE STATION

- Approach partners for financial investment
- Created a sustainability package
 - Affidavit
 - Translation and production provided
- Wynne Broadcasting selling ads and hired part time staff to promote
- Smaller organizations still submit content through KCPH as long as SDOH/Health related

\$20,000
120 commercials/month
Unlimited article submissions

\$15,000 90 commercials/month I article per month

\$10,000 60 commercials/month I article every other month

Katherine Duarte – Klamath County Public Health:


- Added local news translated into Spanish

 - Businesses buying ads

- Student internships


